## USE OF IP ADDRESSES AND COOKIES

A unique number called an IP address identifies every computer on the Internet. Each time you connect to the Internet your machine is assigned an IP address. An IP address is a number that identifies each sender or receiver of information that is sent in packets across the Internet. The Community Foundation for Mississippi only uses your IP address to help diagnose problems with our server, and to administer the [www.formississippi.org](http://www.formississippi.org) website.

"Cookies" are small pieces of information that are stored by your browser on your computer's hard drive. Most Web browsers automatically accept cookies, but if you prefer, you can edit your browser options to block them in the future. The Community Foundation only uses cookies to maintain user session identity, and, in some non-member areas, to store your username and password locally for ease of access.

The Foundation may also collect certain demographic information about visitors to [www.formississippi.org](http://www.formississippi.org) through the use of cookies. The Foundation only uses this data to improve the overall [www.formississippi.org](http://www.formississippi.org) website and for internal business purposes.

## SECURITY

## SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS' INFORMATION

The Community Foundation for Mississippi does not collect information about minors under the age of 13. Scholarship applications are not accepted online, and are accepted only from students 16 or older. Scholarship selection committees may have access to some personal information about applicants in order to make scholarship awards, and the Foundation must transmit certain details about recipients to the financial aid offices of the applicants' approved colleges and universities.

The Foundation has implemented reasonable procedures to protect the confidentiality, security, and integrity of personal information collected from scholarship applicants, and takes reasonable steps to release this personal information only to third parties capable of maintaining its confidentiality, security, and integrity. The Foundation keeps personal information only as long as is reasonably necessary for the purpose for which it was collected, and securely disposes of it once there is no longer a legitimate reason for retaining it.
